# Considerations in the Resource Ownership Debate

As changing economic factors shift the equation on the cost for public power entities to directly own renewable resources, other considerations and mechanisms for private developers (such as accelerated depreciation and more generous domestic content rules) may challenge public power's capital advantages. Review the latest economics and tax implications of the different models for renewable resources under the Inflation Reduction Act and how complex supply chains and required skilled labor arrangements can influence the decision-making process.
