Who is eligible for public power utility membership?

All municipal, state, and other local, government-owned electric utilities in the U.S., its territories and possessions are eligible for membership in this category.

Benefits include:

- National representation on Federal legislative and regulatory issues that impact your utility
 - Opportunities for staff and policymakers to participate in industry-specific conferences and training opportunities at a discounted rate through the APPA Academy
 - Opportunities to access funding for innovative projects and student interns through the Demonstration of Energy & Efficiency Developments research and grant program
 - Opportunities to earn national and local recognition through the Reliable Public Power Provider (RP₃)[®] and the Smart Energy Provider (SEP) programs
 - Ability to participate in the annual awards program for utility/individual service and achievement, safety, and communications
 - Opportunities for staff and policymakers to participate in peer-drive email listservs in more than 20 functional areas
 - Access for staff and policymakers to “members-only” white papers, statistical analysis, and much more on www.PublicPower.org
- Opportunities for staff and policymakers to purchase products at a discounted rate
 - Access to the APPA professional staff
 - Use of the APPA logo to support public power

Dues

Dues are based on revenue and kWh sales figures and customer data provided by the Department of Energy, Energy Information Administration. The EIA compiles this data from Form EIA-861 completed annually by all electric utilities.

New members enjoy a graduated discount on their annual dues: Year 1 – 50% of calculated dues (or minimum annual dues of \$700); Year 2 – 40%; Year 3 – 30%; Year 4 – 20%; Year 5 – 10%; Year 6+ full dues
